

1. Upon arrival, visitors can either enjoy a ½-mile nature walk to the preserve or take a ride on our shuttle bus; both options are available. Once there, you will be invited into an observation area in the center of the preserve, surrounded by four packs of wolves.

2. During this informative guided presentation, visitors will learn about wolf packs' social structure, eating habits, interactions, and other interesting facts. During this time,

you can observe wolves playing and interacting with one another in their natural, wooded habitats. Following the wolf watch, you will be guided to another area to see and learn about the preserve's foxes, bobcats, and lynxes.

- 3. Please know that we are not open to the public all day. You must have a reservation for weekday or weekend tours. Unfortunately, you will not be permitted on the property without having a confirmed reservation.
- 4. Our tours are not private, meaning you will be amongst other visitors. That being said, while we welcome children visiting the preserve, we kindly ask parents to be mindful of other guests and remove disruptive or loud children to the back of the group so that other guests can continue to enjoy the tour and the animals remain visible. We will not tolerate children throwing rocks at the animals or climbing over rock walls to trample in our gardens. Please be respectful of our space.
- 5. Our tours depart at 10:30 a.m. or 3:00 p.m. You must arrive between 9:30 and 10:00

a.m. for the morning tour and between 2:00 and 2:30 p.m. for the afternoon tour to allow sufficient time for registration, parking, and restroom use. The shuttle bus leaves the parking area promptly to start the tour. If you are late, we will not be able to accommodate others who are waiting to hold the tour for you. If you miss the shuttle, you will be considered a 'no show, ' and we will, unfortunately, be unable to accommodate you.

- 6. Each tour lasts approximately 75 minutes.
- 7. The preserve is all outdoors with no shelter from inclement weather. Please dress and plan appropriately. Closed-toe, flat shoes are suggested, as are sunscreen, raincoats, umbrellas, and jackets. Open-back shoes are not permitted on the hiking trail. Our tours are held rain or shine.
- 8. The cost is \$16 for adults and \$7 for children aged 12 and under, plus tax.
- 9. If you cannot enter the total number of people in your party when booking, this means that the tour is FULLY BOOKED, and you will need to pick another date/time. Please do not book partially and show up with other guests. We will be unable to accommodate you.
- 10. We have a limited number of spaces on each tour. Once you secure your spot, you can cancel for a refund within 2 weeks of your reservation date or reschedule up to 48 hrs before your reservation date. We cannot accommodate day-of cancellations or refund/reschedule requests for individuals who fail to appear. Please remember that we are a business and rely on visitors to help care for our animals and keep the preserve running.
- 11. Please note that in the state of New Jersey, contact with purebred wolves is prohibited by law. You cannot interact physically or feed the animals while visiting.
- 12. Schools, Scouts, and any other large groups must also reserve online.

- 13. During the winter months, please call ahead to confirm that the weather permits us to be open. The weather on the mountain changes quickly, and we may need to close for the day due to icy conditions. If we have to close, our answering machine will be updated. If it is not, we are open!
- 14. We do not allow pets. You will be asked to leave if you arrive with a pet in your car. We will not permit pets to be left in your vehicle while on the premises. If you have a service animal, please get in touch with us
- 15. Can I bring snacks or drinks? Yes, but no feeding animals. Please dispose of trash properly.
- 16. Can I take pictures? -Yes! We offer private photography tours.
- 17. Can I smoke or vape? -No! Smoking is prohibited for the safety of animals and fire concerns. Smoke in the parking lot before or after your visit, and dispose of butts properly.
- 18. What should I wear? -Check our Tour Info & Bookings page for details. Call 908.496.9244 for more information.
- 19. Does Lakota Wolf have a gift shop? No, products are available for purchase online only. Visit our Shop, Donate, or Sponsor page.
- 20. How do we book camping? The preserve is located on the grounds of Camp Taylor Campground. Contact them at www.camptaylor.com. You can book Lakota Wolf tours online only.
- 21. Where else do you take wolves? -We do not take animals off-site, except for vet care. Previous hybrid events were unaffiliated with us.

- 22. Is the preserve accessible? -It's outdoors with uneven terrain. We offer a shuttle bus, but we recommend using pushable chairs due to the potential for tipping with motorized options.

About Brook Hollow Winery

Brook Hollow Winery is a family-owned winery located in Warren County, New Jersey, overlooking the Delaware Water Gap. The winery was founded in 2006 by owner and winemaker Paul Ritter, his wife, Debbie, and their three daughters, Stefanie, Alyssa, and Jessica. What began as a hobby in the basement and a few grapevines in the front yard quickly grew to over 2000 grapevines at his home. The hobby became a passion for Paul, and just before retiring as a wildlife biologist after 30 years, the family opened a small weekend winery at Brook Hollow Farm in Knowlton Township, New Jersey.

In a very short period, their winery outgrew the small tasting room at the farm, and a 10-acre field on the farm was purchased, with 7,000 new vines planted. Construction on the new winery began, with a grand opening celebrated in 2013. A New Jersey Farm winery license was obtained, requiring all the wine made from NJ-grown fruit.

Paul takes great pride in his selection of dry table wines and produces a few sweeter ones for everyone to enjoy. One of the most unique and popular drinks at the winery is the frozen wine slushie and the fan favorite Chocolate Merlot Milkshake. (Seasonal.) The winery is open seven days a week and offers daily tastings and sales.





- 7. You will be heading out of town. Then, cross over I-84 and Eureka Stone Quarry. Bridge Street is one mile after the Quarry.
- 8. Turn left onto Bridge Rd
- 9. Go 0.2 mi.
- 10. Turn left onto Sawkill Rd
- 11. Proceed 0.2 miles to the camp gate.
