The Museum, which opened to the public in June 2008, is housed in a beautiful, LEED-certified green building, situated at the top of the Woodstock festival hillside. Within the building, in addition to the Main Exhibit Gallery, Museum Shop, and Muse Café (offering both indoor and outdoor seating), there is a spacious Event Gallery where intimate concerts and other events are frequently held. On the lower level, the Special Exhibit Gallery, Corridor Gallery, and public restrooms are located, as well as the Museum's administrative offices.

Through our award-winning Main Exhibit, "Woodstock and The Sixties," and various and engaging special exhibitions, a growing collection of artifacts and reference materials, museum programs for children, youth, and adults, as well as the preserved historical site, the Museum makes the lessons and ideals of The Sixties relevant and accessible today.

The Museum embodies the key ideas of the era we interpret—peace, respect, cooperation, creativity, engagement, and a connection to the planet we inhabit and all the people who share it. In addition to preserving and interpreting an era, the Museum is actively involved in our community—through education, economic development, and historic preservation—to encourage social responsibility among our visitors and supporters and to advocate for issues that make Sullivan County, and the world at large, a better place. Bethel Woods Center for the Arts is an outdoor performing arts center and museum situated approximately 90 minutes from New York City, at the site of the 1969 Woodstock Music and Art Fair in Bethel, New York.

- The 15,000-seat outdoor performing arts venue and The Museum are set within nearly 800 bucolic acres.
- The Pavilion seats 4,500 under cover, with an additional 10,500 on a natural, sloping lawn, offering unique backdrops of the Sullivan County countryside.
- The Event Gallery, located in The Museum, seats up to 400 for intimate performances spring through fall.
- The Harvest Festival Site features a craft and farmers' market, as well as performances and family-friendly activities on Sundays from Labor Day through Columbus Day weekend.
- The original Woodstock site also holds a permit for 30,000 concertgoers to attend major musical events.

TIPS FOR AN ENJOYABLE MUSEUM VISIT

- Most visitors spend at least an hour and a half to two hours in the museum exhibits. The main exhibit features 21 short films, several interactive displays, and numerous fun and interesting artifacts to explore and learn about. Special exhibits, if scheduled, are included with regular museum admission and can be found on the lower level in the Special Exhibit Gallery and the Corridor Gallery.
- The museum is climate-controlled for your comfort, but if you plan to explore the Woodstock festival site and see the monument, you'll want to wear comfortable walking shoes. A coat or jacket is appropriate if temperatures are incredible, and an umbrella is a good idea if rain has been forecasted. The grassy festival site slopes downward toward West Shore Road, and while the walk down may be easy, please be aware that the walk up the hill could be challenging for young children or visitors with mobility issues.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited throughout the museum building. Smoking is allowed in designated outdoor areas.
- Enjoy a snack or a full meal at our Muse Café, located in the Museum lobby. Dine at tables in the lobby or outside on our covered patio overlooking our terrace gardens and the concert Pavilion.
- Food and drink are not allowed inside the Museum exhibits or in our Museum Shop. This includes children's juice boxes or any snacks.
- Photography IS ALLOWED in the museum for personal, non-commercial use. For the benefit of other museum guests, we kindly request that you refrain from using flash or other supplemental lighting, as well as tripods, monopods, or other bulky equipment within the museum.
- Service animals are ALWAYS welcome, but please leave pets at home. Pets are not allowed at the Bethel Woods Center for the Arts (including the museum), and leaving your pet in the car can be highly hazardous.

For your convenience, Yasgur's Farm Café is located within the museum building. It offers a variety of freshly prepared snacks and full meals, as well as beer and wine, sandwiches, soups, salads, and daily specials. Indoor bistro seating is available, along with covered outdoor seating during warmer weather. The menu has burgers, Paninis, Salads, Quesadillas, and Wraps. The average price for a meal is around \$11.

The Museum at Bethel Woods Unveils 2025 Special Exhibit: How Bazaar: Arts, Crafts, & Camping at Woodstock

March 10, 2025 (Bethel, NY) – The Museum at Bethel Woods, situated on the historic site of the 1969 Woodstock Music and Art Fair, is pleased to announce the opening of its 2025 Special Exhibit, "How Bazaar: Arts, Crafts, & Camping at Woodstock." This exhibit explores two integral pieces of the Woodstock experience: the Bindy Bazaar marketplace and the festival's pioneering approach to on-site camping. Drawing on over five years of extensive research, oral histories, and archaeological investigations, this exhibit invites visitors to explore the rich and often overlooked elements that contributed to Woodstock's legacy.

Woodstock was one of the first major music festivals to offer on-site camping, allowing attendees to remain immersed in the experience without ever leaving the grounds. This communal atmosphere fostered a unique sense of togetherness that became a central aspect of Woodstock's cultural significance. Vast stretches of farmland east and west of the festival site were transformed into vibrant tent cities, providing festival-goers with a peaceful escape in nature as they enjoyed three days of peace, love, and music.

Another key feature of the festival was the Bindy Bazaar, a wooded marketplace designed to serve as the festival's main entrance. Featuring winding trails and vendor booths nestled among the trees, the Bindy Bazaar was intended to bridge the gap between the real world and the festival experience. Attendees strolled through trails like Gentle Path, Groovy Way, and High Way, where artisans and vendors sold a variety of crafts, clothing, and handmade goods. Over the years, extensive research and preservation efforts have uncovered new insights into this area, leading to the restoration of the Bindy Bazaar trails and a deeper understanding of its role in the Woodstock story.

The launch of this exhibit coincides with a new era for Bethel Woods, as the historic site now offers camping opportunities for concert attendees, allowing modern visitors to experience the same landscape that welcomed 450,000 people during the iconic 1969 festival.

"This exhibition is the culmination of years of dedicated research, storytelling, and archaeological exploration, aimed at uncovering a deeper understanding of the Woodstock experience and the nature of our historic site," said Dr. Neal V. Hitch, Museum Director and Senior Curator. "As we continue to activate and preserve new areas of the historic site, we are excited to offer visitors the opportunity to connect with the festival's legacy in a meaningful way and see how its spirit continues to inspire us today."

The exhibition will showcase a selection of artifacts collected over several years in preparation for this event. Many of these connections with donors were fostered through the Museum's ongoing Oral History Initiative, which launched in 2020 and has since preserved over 1,000 stories.

Photographs captured by David Shelburne and generously donated by his wife, Ellen Shelburne, will bring the Woodstock experience to life as large-scale murals of the Bindy Bazaar Woods and Best Road campgrounds. Ellen, who was interviewed for the Museum's oral history project in 2023, returned to the festival site in 2024 for the first time to experience Bethel Woods' new glamping offering and revisit her memories of Woodstock. This journey was highlighted in an AP article.

How Bazaar: Arts, Crafts, & Camping at Woodstock will be open to the public from April 1 through December 31, 2025. Admission to the Special Exhibit is included with a ticket to The Museum at Bethel Woods or can be purchased separately for \$5. Tickets are on sale now at www.BethelWoodsCenter.org.


THE PERMANENT MUSEUM COLLECTION: At the core of every great museum is a great collection. Even before the Museum at Bethel Woods opened its doors in 2008, it began carefully collecting authentic items to help tell the story of the Woodstock festival and 1960s popular culture, politics, and societal change. Through the generosity of our donors, the Museum has assembled an impressive collection of period photographs, film footage, newspapers, and ephemera, as well as clothing, jewelry, posters, and other artifacts, which are utilized in exhibits and for scholarly research. As is the case at other museums, a significant portion of the Bethel Woods Collection is stored in secure facilities rather than on display. This gives the Museum the flexibility to rotate sensitive items off display from time to time and to have significant items in reserve to enliven the Main Exhibit or to draw upon for Special Exhibits.
